Safe Ride

Safe Ride is a service provided to all members of the University community as a safe and free alternative to walking alone after dark. The Safe Ride program will operate daily (Monday-Friday) until 12:00 am. Security Services will pick up a student, faculty, or staff member on campus and deliver that person to **their vehicle** within our Safe Ride boundaries, listed below. When the Safe Ride program is unavailable, students, faculty and staff can still utilize the services of our Safe Walk program, which operates 24hrs per day 7 days a week, within the boundaries of the Bannatyne Campus.

NORTH TO LOGAN AVE
SOUTH TO SARGENT AVE
EAST TO ISABEL AVE
WEST TO MCPHILLIPS STREET AND
BANNING STREET

Rules of Use:

- Safe Rides may be made for up to 3 people total at one time
- Children, unless accompanied by a parent or guardian will not be permitted
- Food is not permitted in the vehicle
- Alcohol (opened or unopened) is not permitted in the vehicle
- Safe Ride drivers will drive only to the planned destination
- Carry-on items must fit in the rider's lap

PARKING LOT SAFETY

A large portion of U of M property is dedicated to parking lots. According to MPI, about 25% of collisions happen in parking lots. In many cases, MPI judges both parties involved in the collision to be responsible 50-50. This should be extra incentive to drive cautiously through parking lots on campus. MPI has the following tips for driving in parking lots.

Drive defensively, which also means slowly, through parking lots always anticipating:

1. a vehicle to back out
2. a pedestrian walking into your path

Tips

- Back into the stall to give yourself a better field of vision when you're leaving
- Waiting to take a parking spot, give the other vehicle enough room to leave
- Park farther away where there are fewer parked vehicles, better sight lines and less chanced having the vehicle beside you smack your door.

The Perfect Spot

Finding a good parking spot on campus can sometimes be challenging and even a little frustrating. When you finally do come across that perfect spot, do not forget to be smart when leaving your car. There are signs in every parking lot that remind you to:

- ✓ Make sure you keep valuables out of sight
- ✓ Make sure your anti-theft devices are on
- ✓ Make sure your doors are locked

SUSPICIOUS

It is important to Security Services that the university community is comfortable and feels safe when spending time on campus. Security Services responds to reports of suspicious people and vehicles on campus.

MEDICAL EMERGENCIES

Security Services responds to all medical emergencies on campus. Sometimes Security Services staff are the first to respond to an emergency, other times they play a key role in guiding the emergency responders to the correct building and room.

SAFE WALK /SAFE RIDE

Safe Walk and Safe Ride is a free service in which Security Services staff will meet you and walk you or give a ride to/from your car, your class, your residence room, or a bus stop. If you don't feel comfortable walking on campus at night, Security Services would be happy to assist you.
