What is the study of Spanish?

Studying in the Spanish program, students learn about the Spanish language and the rich variety of its literature and culture. Three main areas of study are explored:

- Language: the study of the vocabulary, grammar and syntax of the Spanish language
- Literature & Cinema: the study of poetry, prose and drama from various historical periods
- Culture & Civilization: the study of the developmet of Spanish civilization and culture

What is unique about Spanish at the UM?

The Spanish program strives to engage students in the processes of critical reading and writing, taking as the object of study the literary, linguistic, cultural and cinematic heritage of Spain and Latin America. To develop students' communicative skills, the program provides instruction that assists students in acquiring and refining the ability to speak, understand, read and write the Spanish language. Moreover, the program's literature courses enable students to examine a wide range of periods and genres, and to tailor their plans of study according to their specific interest.

The Spanish program has an active student group - the Spanish club where students may practice language skills, make friends and participate in cultural events.
