The Manitoba Teachers' Society Bursary in Education for Indigenous Students

The Manitoba Teachers' Society offers annual bursary support to an Indigenous student in the Faculty of Education at the University of Manitoba. This award was established in the 125th anniversary year of the University of Manitoba. Each year, one bursary valued at \$3,000 shall be offered to an undergraduate student who:

- (1) is Indigenous (Status, non-Status, Métis, Inuit);
- (2) is enrolled full-time (minimum 60% course load) in any undergraduate program offered by the Faculty of Education at the University of Manitoba;
- (3) has achieved a minimum degree grade point average of 2.5;
- (4) has demonstrated financial need on the standard University of Manitoba bursary application form.

Preference in selection shall be given to students in their final year of study toward the Bachelor of Education degree.

A student may only receive one of either the Manitoba Teachers' Society Bursary in Education or the Manitoba Teachers' Society Bursary in Education for Indigenous Students.

The selection committee shall be named by the Dean of the Faculty of Education (or designate).

The Board of Governors of the University of Manitoba has the right to modify the terms of this award if, because of changed conditions, it becomes necessary to do so. Such modification shall conform as closely as possible to the expressed intention of the donor in establishing the award.
