A smudging ceremony is an Indigenous tradition which involves the burning of plant medicines including: sweetgrass, sage and/or cedar. This may produce a distinct aroma but the smoke associated with it is minimal and lasts a very short time.

Under the Province of Manitoba's "The Non-Smokers Health Protection Act" smudging is permitted. The University of Manitoba recognizes that smudging is a part of the Indigenous traditional way of life and is therefore permitted on campus.
