COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Work term report, completed in conjunction with the coop placement, designed to integrate professional experiences with the concepts and theories explored through academic study. Students must be admitted into the Coop program to be registered, and receive credit. Prerequisite: ENVR 3980 (128.398) (P). Prerequisites or Concurrent Requirements: ENVR 3900 (128.390), and ENVR 3990 (128.399).

TECHNICAL WRITTEN REPORT OR PRESENTATION (Worth 100% of final grade)

Consult with the course instructor to identify a relevant topic for the report. The topic must reflect on an aspect of the workterm placement and must provide opportunity to describe, evaluate and contrast applied experience in the work placement with concepts and theories acquired from previous academic study. The topic must be approved by the course instructor. An outline detailing the topic is required within one month following the completion of the workterm (e.g., Fall term by September 30th, Winter term by January 30th). Indicate in the outline whether you will be developing a PowerPoint presentation or submitting a technical written report.

Presentations are scheduled for November (Fall term registration) and March (Winter term registration). The Instructor will contact students to identify preferred presentations dates/times in advance.

Written technical reports must be submitted to the instructor no later than November 30th (Fall term registration) or March 31st (Winter term registration). Electronic submissions on the UM Learn website are preferred.

Refer to the *Report Guidelines (attached)* for further details regarding the composition and format for the presentation and/or written report.
