Medical books to Kabul

MORE than 90 boxes of medical textbooks collected by University of Manitoba medical students will leave today for the Kabul Medical Institute Library in Afghanistan.

The U of M students collected

more than 1,700 medical texts from across the country to rebuild the Kabul Medical Institute Library.

The project was started in 2002 by radiology professor Richard Gordon. The U of M medical students association took it on as a class project in 2003 and it was later adopted by the Canadian Federation of Medical Students, which represents 13 medical schools across Canada.

The books have been stored at the warehouses of Login Brothers Canada, a medical textbook distributor with headquarters in Winnipeg.
