1. Program costs are calculated by multiplying the average cost per credit hour in a given faculty by the number of credit hours required to attain a degree. The number of credit hours that are required for a degree are taken from the General Calendar. Financial data are taken from the Annual Financial Report March 31.
2. Effective Fall Term 2014, the Department of Human Nutritional Sciences moved from the Faculty of Human Ecology to the Faculty of Agricultural and Food Sciences. Comparisons with previous years should be made with caution.
3. Due to the diversity of degrees available through the Clayton H. Riddell Faculty of Environment, Earth, and Resources, these program costs are an approximation based on 90 credit hours for a three-year degree and 120 credit hours for a four-year degree.
4. Effective November 2014, the Faculties of Dentistry, Medicine, Nursing, and Pharmacy became colleges in the Faculty of Health Sciences. The College of Rehabilitation Sciences (formerly, the School of Medical Rehabilitation) and the School of Dental Hygiene also became part of the new faculty.
5. The cost for programs in the Colleges of Dentistry and Medicine are calculated by multiplying the cost per standard student by the number of years required to attain a degree.
6. The Diploma program in Dental Hygiene is a two-year program; these costs reflect the two-year component.
