A Term to Know



“LEGACY” – will apply to a student AND the curriculum in place prior to Fall 2023

Legacy Student: A BSW student who was admitted under the legacy curriculum, prior to Fall 2023

A LEGACY student may choose to “TRANSFER” to the new BSW curriculum, but they will be subject to all the requirements of the new curriculum including the admission requirements

Legacy Curriculum: The BSW courses that were part of the BSW curriculum prior to Fall 2023


CURRICULUM CHANGES FOR 2023!

What does it mean for me and completing the requirements for my BSW degree?

- A new curriculum is rolling out starting Fall 2023 and its new courses will be rolled out over a 2-year time period
- Where a course in the legacy (Pre-Fall 2023) curriculum is deleted and no longer offered, an equivalent course(s) will be taken to fulfill that requirement
- You will still be able to complete your BSW degree, the changes will NOT affect your progress!



Options for Legacy Students



"Legacy" = 2022 admission or earlier

Things to Note

Not all the new courses will be available in 2023/2024- all but a few electives will be available by 2024/2025.

Almost all the legacy courses have an equivalent course in the new curriculum

The number of credit hours needed to graduate has NOT changed

Transferring to the new curriculum as a legacy student will likely mean longer to degree completion and more credits.


The few legacy courses that don't have a new course equivalent will be available for many terms.

Integrative Seminars are built into Field Instruction 1 & 2 respectively. This addition will help to integrate theory and practice and align with new field courses




