A broad range of academic integrity supports for students and academic staff are available at the University of Manitoba. Here are a few to remind you of what is available:

- [The Centre for the Advancement of Teaching and Learning](#) provides instructors with suggestions and resources for promoting academic integrity and preventing academic misconduct.
- [Student Advocacy](#) and the [Student Counselling Centre](#) are excellent sources of support for students as they encounter challenges in their academic and personal life. Encourage students to seek out help before they feel too overwhelmed.
