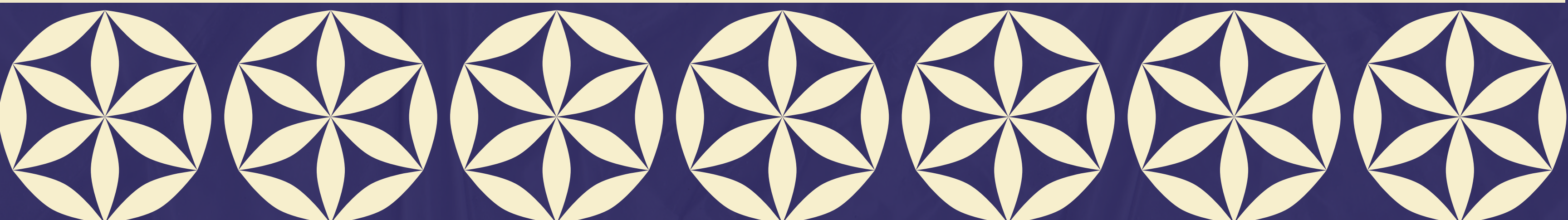

Letter of Participation

LETTER OF PARTICIPATION IN UKRAINIAN CANADIAN HERITAGE STUDIES PARTICIPANTS ARE REQUIRED TO ATTEND A COMBINATION OF LECTURES AND (OR) READING CLUB MEETINGS IN ORDER TO BE ELIGIBLE TO OBTAIN THE LETTER OF PARTICIPATION. THE LECTURE SERIES TAKE PLACE FROM SEPTEMBER UNTIL MAY AND COVER A WIDE RANGE OF UKRAINIAN AND UKRAINIAN CANADIANS TOPICS. READING CLUB MEETINGS TAKE PLACE ON BIMONTHLY BASIS AND INVOLVE A DISCUSSION OF A NEW UKRAINIAN/UKRAINIAN CANADIAN BOOK AT EACH SESSION.

REQUIREMENTS

Entrance Requirements:

Any individual that resides in Canada who is interested in Ukraine or Ukrainian Canadiana is welcome to pursue the Letter of Participation in Ukrainian Canadian Heritage Studies. Expressions of interest can be submitted to cucs@umanitoba.ca.

Participation Requirements:

Participants are required to attend a minimum of seven lectures or a minimum of five lectures and two reading club meetings to be eligible to obtain the letter of participation.

Performance Requirements:

Participants will be evaluated based on attendance. Participation in the discussions and Q&A sessions is recommended.

The mission of the Centre for Ukrainian Canadian Studies is to create, preserve and communicate knowledge related to Ukrainian Canadian culture and scholarship.

Letters of Participation in Ukrainian Canadian Studies will allow students and members of the Ukrainian community to further their knowledge of Ukraine and Ukrainian Canadiana.

ACTIVITIES

The **monthly lecture series** runs September 2021 - May 2022. Lectures cover a wide range of Ukrainian and Ukrainian Canadian topics. *Viewing lectures on YouTube after the session has taken place will not count toward the minimum requirements.

Reading club meetings take place every two months featuring a new Ukrainian/Ukrainian Canadian book at each session.

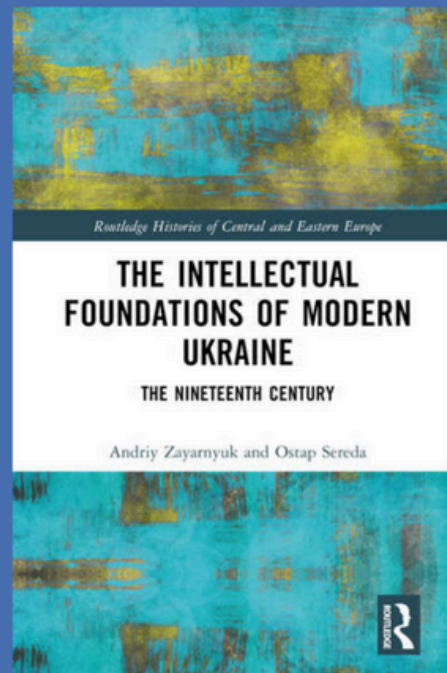
