# Withdrawing from/Dropping courses

Students should be cautious when withdrawing/dropping courses as some courses are offered in one particular term only and unlikely to be offered in Summer Session. Some courses are only offered in alternate years. It is very important to take note of whether a course is a pre and/or co-requisite course to another prior to withdrawing or deleting the course. You should contact an Academic Advisor to consult on how withdrawing/dropping courses may affect your graduation date or your continuation in the program. # **Important Registration Information:**

New and currently registered students will be sent registration information in June of each year and will be available at:

The information will specify which courses B.Ed. Staff will register the student in and provide guidance on which courses students are responsible to register for themselves. Students should take particular care in ensuring they are aware of and register for ALL pre-requisite and co-requisite courses. Students who VW from a pre-requisite course must ensure they also VW from course(s) requiring the pre-requisite. Failure to do so may result in being removed from the associated required courses and delaying graduation from the B.Ed. program.

Students are also responsible for acquainting themselves with all VW and Fee Payment and Fee Refund deadline dates as specified in AURORA and/or the UM General Calendar or the appropriate UM websites.
