#1 Explore

Ensure you meet the University of Manitoba's admission requirements and apply by the specified deadlines. Application fees are \$100 for Canadian citizens and permanent residents, and \$130 for international students. Review the Application Portal for any outstanding documents at umanitoba.ca/apply.

Accept your offer by the deadline indicated in your acceptance letter and start planning your university journey at umanitoba.ca/nextsteps.

Important:

All course registration, Orientation and tuition information will be emailed. Check your email often!

Direct Entry (High school students)

If you are coming to university directly from high school or have completed less than one year of university studies, you'll take the Direct Entry route.

Direct Entry Routes:

University 1

- Provides flexibility if you are undecided or choosing between programs.
- A great place to start if you require one or more year(s) of study for your program of choice.
- Ideal if you don't yet meet the admission requirements for your program of choice.

Faculty Entry

- Provides direct admission into certain programs that offer a Direct Entry option.
- An ideal option if you are academically strong in the prerequisite courses for your chosen program and meet all admission requirements.

Advanced Placement (AP) and International Baccalaureate (IB)

The University of Manitoba recognizes the Advanced Placement (AP) and International Baccalaureate (IB) programs for admission, scholarships and university transfer credit.

Advanced Entry (Transfer Students)

If you have completed one or more years of university study (24 credit hours or more), you can apply through the Advanced Entry route. External transfer students may receive a maximum of two years (60 credit hours) of transferable credit to be applied towards a UM degree, subject to faculty regulations and requirements.

1. General Admission Requirement: Manitoba high school graduation with 5 full S, G, U or C credits at the Grade 12 level.

ADMISSION PROCESS (INTERNATIONAL)

English language proficiency

If English isn't your first language, or if you're from a country where English isn't the primary language, you might need to demonstrate English language proficiency before you're admitted. You can demonstrate English proficiency in a number of different ways:

OPTION 1: WRITE A TEST

- International English Language Testing System (IELTS)
- Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL)
- Duolingo English Test

OPTION 2: QUALIFY FOR A WAIVER

- Graduation from a Canadian curriculum secondary school with a year 12 English literature grade of 75 per cent or higher.
- Successful completion of three consecutive years of school in Canada or in a country where English is a primary language.
- Ten consecutive years of residency in Canada or in a country where English is a primary language.
- Achieve a grade of four or greater on the International Baccalaureate Higher Level English course, or a grade of four or greater on the Advanced Placement English examination (Language Composition; Literature and Composition).

English Language Centre

If you meet the academic admission criteria, but don't meet the English language proficiency requirements, we can help. The University of Manitoba can accept you on the condition that you successfully complete Level 5 of the Intensive Academic English Program (IAEP).

Our program features:

- Small classes averaging 12 students.
- Dedicated student advising.
- Multiple opportunities to transition to university.
- Social, cultural and recreational events.

Entrance scholarships

High school students with outstanding academic averages may be rewarded through our generous entrance scholarship program.

GENERAL ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIP

85-89.9% \$1,000 | 90-94.9% \$2,000 | 95-100% \$3,000

To be eligible for a general entrance scholarship, students must demonstrate a minimum interim average of 85% over five 40S courses in approved subject areas*. For example:

- Applied Math or Pre-Calculus Math
- Biology
- Chemistry
- Computer Science
- English/Anglais or Français
- Any other language

Bursaries

Band funding

Sponsorship and government benefits

For eligible Indigenous students, financial sponsorship may include tuition, fees, mandatory books, supplies, allowance and travel costs.

- **Treaty/Status First Nation students** can apply for sponsorship. Students should contact their Education Authority, Band or Tribal Council from their community.
- **Inuit students** should contact designated organizations or regional Indigenous Services Canada (ISC) to determine eligibility for sponsorship.

- **Métis students** entering full-time studies may be eligible for sponsorship. Students are advised to contact the MMF Post-Secondary Education Support Program.

Once accepted to UM, the EmpoweringU Financial Wellness Program is available to assist Indigenous students with setting financial goals, budgeting and debt management. Canadian student loans

Students with a status of Canadian Citizen, Permanent Resident, or Refugee can apply to their provincial government for student aid.

Loan amounts are repayable once a student is no longer in full-time

studies. Students attending the Fall and Winter Terms are encouraged to apply with their provincial government before June 30. umanitoba.ca/financial-aid-and-awards/government-student-loans

U.S. government loans

American students can apply for government student loans under the William D. Ford Federal Direct Loan Program. To apply for a Direct Loan, complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and the University's US Loan Funding Application. 

TUITION AND FEES

The cost of a university education is more than just tuition and books. Estimate your living costs to create an education budget: rent, damage deposit, housing insurance, utilities, child care, family expenses, groceries and vehicle costs. Don't be discouraged by the cost of education, especially if your chosen career is in demand. Most students pay for post-secondary education with a combination of funds from many sources: savings, scholarships, bursaries, sponsorship, wages and loans.


