## UKRAINIAN STUDIES SCHOLARSHIP

The **Irena Knysh Undergraduate Scholarship in Ukrainian Studies** scholarship is available to an undergraduate student who: is enrolled full-time in the Faculty of Arts in the final year of any degree program; has achieved a minimum degree grade point average of 3.5; and will complete an honours thesis or major paper in the area of Ukrainian studies using the archives of the Ukrainian Canadian Experience. Preference will be given, in the following order, to students who will use the archives of the Ukrainian Canadian Experience in order to conduct research related to: 1) the life and works of Irena Knysh; 2) the Ukrainian women's movement, with particular attention to its North American (Canada and the United States of America) expression; 3) Ukrainian and Ukrainian Canadian history, politics, and culture. If you would like to apply, please submit the following to the Faculty of Arts (307 Fletcher Argue Building) **by May 31**: a description of proposed honours thesis or major paper (maximum 500 words); and one academic letter of reference from a professor at a post-secondary institution.
