CALL FOR PAPERS

The symposium **Masquerade and Masking in Prairie Canada** will be held in Winnipeg, June 5-7, 2014. Organizers invite proposals for papers or panels on masking, mumming, and other aspects of traditional performance in prairie Canada. They seek to explore not only the representation of self as someone (or something) else, but also the social and cultural meanings of such performances for diverse community audiences. The symposium brings together researchers and performers to discuss all aspects of vernacular entertainment production. Contributions could be from a range of disciplines and studies including: race, culture, gender, indigenous, postcolonial, and religious studies as well as anthropology, folklore, history, politics, and sociology. Submit panel and individual abstracts of approx. 250 words (also include a one paragraph bio.) by September 30 to maskingmummingperformance@gmail.com. To improve the discussions, your 2500 word paper is requested for circulation by February 25. Organizers also plan to publish an edited volume on the topic, and invite essays of 8,000-10,000 words (inclusive of references) by August 15.
