ASSIGNMENTS:

1. Weekly 3-page essays on the reading from Capital assigned for that week. Of the 8 or 9 which will be assigned, students are expected to do 6 of them. (The first two, however, are compulsory) **They are due by Monday noon.** This will count for 60% of the final grade.

2. A final 10-page paper, (about 2500-3000 words), whose subject will be assigned three weeks before the final class and due for that class. This will count for 40% of the final grade.

3. In addition, students will be called upon to lead the discussion during the first hour of the weekly seminar. Two students per week will be assigned that function; it will involve preparing questions and subjects for discussion.

No make-up tests or late assignments except for legitimate reasons.
