COURSE OBJECTIVES

To study Marx's Capital Volume I

ASSIGNMENTS:

1. Weekly 3-page essays on the reading assigned for that week. Of the 5 which will be assigned, students are expected to do 4 of them. (The first two, however, are compulsory) This will count for 50% of the final grade.
2. A final 10-page paper, (about 2500-3000 words), whose subject will be assigned two weeks before the final class and will be due for that class. This will count for 50% of the final grade.
3. In addition, students will be called upon to lead the discussion during part of the weekly seminar. Two students per week will be assigned this function; this will involve preparing questions and subjects for discussion.

No make-up or late assignments except for legitimate reasons.
