**COURSE OBJECTIVES**

To spend a term studying writings of Michel Foucault.

**ASSIGNMENTS:**

1. During the term, four short essays will be assigned (4 – page length), each related to the readings of the week. Students are expected to do three of the four assigned. **They will each be due by Wednesday noon.** This will count for 50% of the final grade.
2. A final 10-page paper, (about 2500-3000 words), whose subject will be assigned two weeks before the final class and due for that class. This will count for 50% of the final grade.
3. In addition, students will be called upon to lead the discussion during the first hour of the weekly seminar. Two students per week will be assigned this function; it will involve preparing questions and subjects for discussion.
