Objectives of the course:

This course examines the social processes involved in becoming and being mentally ill. Topics such as gender and mental disorder, images of madness, and decision-making rules in the psy-professions will be considered.

Course requirements:

May 7: Introduction and overview of the course

May 8 – May 17:

The first section of the course examines issues that are critical to a Sociology of Mental Disorder including the role of social factors in the construction and 'diagnosis' of mental illness, the methods used to study mental disorders and the social control of **deviance**.

Readings: Busfield, Men, Women and Madness, Introduction and Part I.

May 22 - 30:

The second section of the course engages a focused analysis of the various accounts of the origins of mental disorder, including for example, biological explanations, feminist psychologies and socio-political processes. These attempts to 'explain' mental disorder will be scrutinized in relation to the regulation of normality.
