UM SAFE APP

UM Safe is a vital mobile safety app that delivers timely safety alerts and provides quick access to campus safety resources. The app offers features such as **Work Alone**, **FriendWalk**, and a **Mobile BlueLight**, which functions similarly to the physical blue light emergency stations located across campus.

Some features involve direct interaction with Security Services, while others are optional or function independently without Security Services involvement.

UM Safe is used by hundreds of higher education institutions and millions of users worldwide. It was developed by **App Armor** and is custom-branded for the University of Manitoba.

This free app is available to students, staff, and faculty on both **iPhone (App Store)** and **Android (Google Play Store)** devices.

The **Mobile BlueLight** feature will connect users to Security Services when they are within campus **Safe Walk** boundaries. If activated outside these boundaries, the alert will be directed to **911**.
