

Questions from Sept. 20 Event

Q: How can students upgrade courses to be admissible to UM?

A: UM offers some preparatory courses in select subjects for students who may be missing certain high school pre-requisites, and <u>preparatory skills</u> courses are offered through Extended Education. However, these are mostly for satisfying high school pre-requisites for specific UM courses. Students must meet our <u>undergraduate admission requirements</u> in order to be admitted to UM. See our <u>Admissions Webinar</u> for more information.

Q: Will viewbooks be mailed out to schools?

A: Most local area (Manitoba and Northwestern Ontario) schools will have already received a shipment of UM viewbooks, but you are always welcome to request more. Please email us your request, as well as the shipping address, to: <u>student recruitment@umanitoba.ca</u>

Q: Is the Post-Secondary Club offered by Indigenous Student Recruitment + Community Relations available for rural schools?

A: At this time, Post-Secondary Club is focused on Winnipeg area schools, but please contact the Indigenous Student Recruitment team for more information: <u>indigenous recruitment@umanitoba.ca</u>

Q: Where can students find information about scholarships and bursaries?

A: The <u>Financial Aid and Awards website</u> contains information about all available entrance awards for undergraduate students, including a searchable awards database. Q: Have there been any changes to the approved course list for entrance scholarships?

A: The approved course list for entrance scholarship consideration has largely remained the same, with no significant changes. You can view the list of approved academic 40S courses <u>here</u>.

Q: Are International Baccalaureate (IB) entrance scholarships only available for full IB diploma students, or are partial IB students considered?

A: Full IB diploma students will be considered for the IB entrance scholarship, similar to how students taking eligible 40S academic courses would be considered for the general entrance scholarship. Students taking partial IB courses are eligible for top-up scholarship awards, on top of their general entrance scholarship. More information can be found <u>here</u>.

Q: Can entrance scholarships be deferred?

A: No. Admission offers as well as scholarship offers cannot be deferred to other terms or years. We recommend students only apply to their intended term of study.
