Act of Misconduct Definitions: Academic Integrity	Minimum Penalty Penalties may be increased or decreased based on aggravating or mitigating factors
First-time term work offenses in any of: ▪ Plagiarism ▪ Inappropriate collaboration ▪ Unauthorized content generation ▪ Duplicate submission ▪ Contract cheating	▪ Grade of zero on assignment ▪ Disciplinary statement on transcript for one year or until program completion Educational requirements are also assigned and typically include: ▪ Meeting with Academic Integrity Coordinator ▪ Completion of Reflections on Academic Integrity course
Second-time term work offenses in any of: ▪ Plagiarism ▪ Inappropriate collaboration ▪ Unauthorized content generation ▪ Duplicate submission ▪ Contract cheating	▪ F-DISC final grade in the course; DISC designation removed after one year or program completion ▪ Disciplinary statement on transcript for one year or until program completion Educational outcomes may also be assigned.
Third-time or subsequent term work offenses in any of: ▪ Plagiarism ▪ Inappropriate collaboration ▪ Unauthorized content generation ▪ Duplicate submission ▪ Contract cheating First-time or subsequent offenses in any of: ▪ Cheating on quizzes, tests, or the final exam ▪ Impersonation ▪ Academic fraud of any kind	▪ F-DISC final grade in the course; DISC designation removed after one year or program completion ▪ Disciplinary statement on transcript for one year or until program completion ▪ Suspension from taking EE courses for one year
